The amendment 09:05:48 22 creates an alternate window of leave for employees who 09:05:52 23 elect to take family leave to bond with a child placed 09:05:52 24 in the home after an adoption has been legally 09:05:56 25 finalized.

With this amendment, if 09:07:19 7 the employee elects not to take leave in that 12-month 09:07:22 8 period, an alternate window of family leave is 09:07:25 9 available that is comprised of the 12-month period 09:07:28 10 following the date of the finalization of legal 09:07:31 11 adoption. Employees are only eligible for family 09:07:34 12 leave to bond with a child during one of these 09:07:37 13 windows, not both, and the maximum duration of leave 09:07:40 14 remains at 12 weeks. 09:07:44 15 We are now ready to accept public comment on this 09:07:47 16 proposed rule change. 09:07:48 17 Maggie Humphreys, I see your hand raised. 09:07:55 18 MS. MAGGIE HUMPHREYS: Thank you. And thank 09:07:56 19 you to the ESD for convening today's hearing. 09:07:58 20 For the record, my name is Maggie Humphreys. My 09:08:01 21 last name is spelled H-U-M-P-H-R-E-Y-S.
