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Today's hearing is regarding the proposal that revises sections of Washington Administrative Code regarding the definition of healthcare provider, designated representatives, and other topics.

MS. BENHAM: Good morning, I'm Janette Benham.

I'm the rules coordinator here at the Employment

Security Department for the Leave and Care

Division. Welcome.

MR. CAIN: Good morning, my name's Brett Cain.

I'm part of the rules team with the Leave and Care

Division at the Employment Security Department.

Welcome, everyone.

MR. BARRETT: Thank you, Janette and Brett.

Please be advised that this hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter and is also being recorded by the Microsoft Teams platform. The transcript and recording will become a part of the official rulemaking file.

A concise explanatory statement of the agency's reasons for adoption of the rules including a summary and response to all comments received after the publication of the proposed rules will be placed in the permanent rulemaking file and posted online. This document will be sent to all interested parties who have signed up to receive Paid Family and Medical Leave rules e-mails.

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1	We will begin with Brett Cain, who will
2	provide a brief explanation of the proposal.
3	MR. CAIN: Thanks, Jason.
4	And bear with me for a minute here. Most of
5	the amendments are minor, but we did amend several
6	sections of our current rules.
7	So the first rule in today's hearing modifies
8	the definition of healthcare provider to include
9	naturopathic physicians licensed under Chapter
10	18.36A RCW.
11	The second rule is the first of three rules
12	the Department is repealing because they relate to
13	the Pandemic Leave Assistance program, which is no
14	longer available due to statutory timelines.
15	The third rule updates language in an example
16	to remove gender-specific pronouns.
17	The fourth rule is the second of three
18	repealers related to Pandemic Leave Assistance
19	grants.
20	The fifth rule sets the prevailing interest
21	rate for late payments associated with damages at
22	1 percent per month, which aligns with the interest
23	rate for late premium payments.
24	The sixth rule aligns backdating timelines

associated with good cause with timelines

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1 associated with all other backdating reasons.

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The seventh rule is the third of three repealers related to Pandemic Leave Assistance grants.

The eighth and ninth rules refer to weekly claim reporting requirements. This change aligns our rule language with statutory language and agency practice that requires employees to report hours worked in self-employment on a weekly claim for benefits.

The tenth and final rule gives the Department discretion to allow for the designation of an authorized representative without written documentation in certain situations.

I encourage you all to read the text of the rules along with the supporting documents that are available on our rulemaking web page for a more robust understanding.

Thank you for your interest and participation in our rulemaking efforts, and we look forward to hearing your comments today.

 spelled R-O-S-S. I am a licensed naturopathic

 physician here in Washington State, and I am the

 executive director of the Washington Association of

1 Naturopathic Physicians.

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I did participate in the initial stakeholder

meeting on this, so my comments are largely the

same. And it's just to, you know, let you all know

that the naturopathic physicians in Washington are

really grateful to be included. It's kind of an

interesting thing. We've been doing this work for

quite some time and then sort of realized that

somehow we had been left out of the initial thing,

so we're really grateful.

This is going to be a huge help to our patients who rely on us for primary care services here in Washington State. And, yeah, that's it. I just want to express gratitude and support for the inclusion of naturopathic physicians in that first rule change.

MR. BARRETT: Thank you, Dr. Ross. I apologize for not using the correct prefix for you earlier.
